Dear Friends,

What you will be tasting here is the libretto I created for "The Passion," an original Holy Week oratorio composed in 2003 by Ray Vincent Adams, founding conductor of the Aspen Choral Society. Ray Adams (1952-2013) was a talented conductor, composer, brilliant and brave creative spirit, and a close personal friend. "The Passion" was the fourth and final in a series of original oratorios that poured out of him during the early years of the 21 st century, following closely on the heels of his "Angels" (1999), "Revelation" (2001)," and "Requiem" (2003). For this new choral setting of the Passion narrative, Ray wanted a new libretto, scripturally rooted, but portraying Jesus's paschal selfoblation not in the traditional modes of victimhood and scapegoating (all too often tragically directed at the Jewish people), but in terms of a free offering of conscious, universal love. It's a message that still needs insistent replaying—perhaps even more today than in 2003. Wisdom Waypoints is grateful to be able share this libretto once again, now in a handsome new format created by Andrew Breitenberg, for your own Holy Week deepening and reflection.

{ORCHESTRAL INTRODUCTION}

Jesus: Come, now, let us depart,

{ORCHESTRAL BRIDGE}

Jesus: Abba, if it be your will, let this cup pass from me.

MT 26:39 Yet not my will but yours be done.

Chorus: Unless a grain of wheat falls into the ground and dies,

JN 12:26 It remains a single grain,

But if it dies, it shall yield a rich harvest.

Narrator: While Jesus was still speaking,

Jesus: Judas, would you betray the Son of man with a kiss?

Twisted, fugal chant builds as phrases are added from Men's Chorus:

Draw your swords! Stand your ground! Turn them back!

Narrator: And one of them struck the servant of the high priest,

Cutting off his ear.

Jesus: NO MORE OF THIS! Am I a rebel,

LK 22:51 That you come for me with swords and clubs?

Every day I was with you in the temple, And you did not lay a hand on me.

But this is your hour, when darkness reigns.

Chorus: Blessed are you when they shall revile you,

MT 5:11 Persecute you, and falsely say all manner of evil

Against you for my sake. Rejoice and be glad, for Great is your reward in Heaven. In the same way they

Persecuted the prophets who were before you.

Narrator: Then seizing him, they led him away

To the house of the high priest.

{MUSIC BEGINS; CROWD CHANTS}

Men's Chorus:

(The first two lines are an essential ostinato on which centers the entire section. The following lines are added, combined, overlaid, as the intensity builds.)

(COLLATED This man calls himself the Son of God, FROM ALL The Christ, Messiah, the Anointed One.

THE GOSPELS)

He sets himself above the Law, the prophets.

He heals on the Sabbath,

Befriends the poor, the outcasts

Dines with prostitutes! Tax collectors!

Dances to a music all his own That melts our hearts of stone... Calls himself the Son of God...

Caiphas: Are you the Son of God?

LK 22:70

Jesus: I AM... I AM...

Men's Chorus: To Pilate! To Pilate!

{CHANT REPRISES WITH MORE INTENSITY}

Pilate: Are you King of the Jews?

LK 23:3

Jesus: My Kingdom is not of this world.

JN 18:36-7 If it were, my servants would fight for me.

My Kingdom is from above.

For this I was born

And for this I came into the world:

To Testify to truth.

Pilate: What is Truth?

JN 18:38

Chorus: I am the Way, the Truth, The Life

JN 14:6 No one comes to the Father except through me;

You shall know the truth and it shall set you free.

{MEN'S CHORUS THEME RE-ENTERS; TURMOIL BUILDS}

Pilate: I find no charge against him.

What would you have me do?

Crowd: Crucify! Crucify!

Pilate: Shall I crucify your king?

Crowd: We have no King but Caesar!

CRUCIFY! CRUCIFY

Part IV On the Cross

Narrator: And they led him away to be crucified,

LK 23:26-7 To the place called Golgatha, the Skull.

Wailing and mourning, the women who loved him Followed behind him, those few who still cared.

Jesus: Daughters of Jerusalem, do not weep for me;

LK 23:28-9 Weep for yourselves and for your children.

The time will come when you will say,

'Blessed are the barren women, the wombs

that never bore and the breasts that never nursed.'

(Women's chorus may repeat.)

Narrator: Two criminals, were also crucified there beside him,

LK 23:32-3 One on his right, the other on his left.

Upon his head, a crown of thorns,

Above him t hung a sign:

Men's Chorus: (a chant, building from a hissing whisper)

JESUS OF NAZARETH, KING OF THE JEWS

(This merges with following, a darker reprise of the earlier "crucify" chant)

MT 27:40 You, you who claimed you were the living temple,

SAVE YOURSELF!

Come down from the cross if you are the Son of God,

The Chosen One, the Christ!

(Music builds. In a brief eye of the storm, Jesus cries out)

Jesus: Father, forgive them. They know not what they do.

Men's Chorus: Save, save yourself if you are the Son of God.

MT 27:42

1st Criminal: He saved others; himself he cannot save

2nd **Criminal:** Do you not fear God, since you are under the same

Sentence? We are punished justly for our deeds, but
